# **Spring Has Sprung!**

As I take my dog out for her early morning tour of the yard, I can't help but notice the birds singing cheerfully, even though it is still less than 40° outside. The birds are also excited as if to say, "spring is here, spring is here!" And, if you listen real close, you can hear them say, "this is the day that the Lord has made." What a blessing it is to hear their excitement.

Spring, a time for new growth, new beginnings, and a time to start planting seeds for the harvest. I've always been taught that Jesus was a carpenter, and I believe that. But you have to wonder if He could have been a good farmer. In many of his talks he tells us how to plant seeds, where to plant seeds, and what happens when we don't plant the seeds correctly. Jesus tells us that seeds are not living when planted, but that with proper care, they will grow and produce more seed.

"To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven:" (Ecc 3:1). Now is the time to plant seeds for our continual growth. It is also time to start thinking about nominating a new Assistant Lay Director, as my term ends in October. Pray for David Wissmann as he takes over as Lay Director. The Assistant Lay Director is a two-year term that continues for another two years as Lay Director. # How Does God Change Us? Be Transformed.

Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind." Romans 12:2

These words, written by the Apostle Paul to the church in Rome, are one of the greatest passages in scripture. They contain the wisdom and Grace of God, the wisdom and Grace that we need to change us. We should humbly come to these words expecting God to act inside of us, transforming every aspect of our lives.

As the Prayer Book says about all of scripture, with these words we need "to hear, mark, learn and inwardly digest them." We need to digest these words inwardly until they become a part of us. As these words become part of us, God will transform us.

In this scripture passage, it is clear that the only way to change our lives is to change our thinking. God tells us, "Be transformed by the renewing of your mind." Real transformation must be from the inside out, and must begin with the "renewal of our minds." New thinking is the beginning of new actions. In order to let God act in our lives, we must let God's Word change our thinking. This is why it is so important to read the Bible and ask ourselves, "What is God trying to say to me through this scripture passage?" God's Word needs to be inwardly digested for transformation to happen.

# "Only a real risk tests the reality of a belief." C.S. Lewis

In the recent movie, *God is Not Dead*, Josh a college freshman who is a Christian, takes the risk of trying to argue for God's existence in an Introduction to Philosophy class taught by a hostile Atheist. His girlfriend, his parents and others urge him not to take this risk. He needs a good grade in the philosophy class because he is a pre-law major and a bad grade would affect his chances of getting into a top law school. To stand up for this faith in the philosophy class would be taking a big risk. Living a life of faith always involves taking risks, stepping out into an uncertain future. Faith means trusting God in the midst of uncertainty.

In the movie, Josh quotes C. S. Lewis, "Only a real risk tests the reality of a belief." To see what this quote means, we need some more explanation. C. S. Lewis says, "You never know how much you believe anything until its truth or falsehood becomes a matter of life and death to you. It is easy to say you believe a rope to be strong and sound as long as you are merely using it to cord a box. But suppose you had to hang by that rope over a precipice. Wouldn't you then discover how much you really trusted it? The same with people. For years, I would have said that I had perfect confidence in B.R. Then came the moment when I had to decide whether I would or would not trust him with a really important secret. That threw a quite a new light on what I called my 'confidence' in him. I discovered that there is no such thing. Only a real risk tests the reality of a belief." A Grief Observed, London: Faber and Faber, 1961, pp. 20-21).

True faith in God takes risks, and as risks are taken, the reality of God is discovered. Faith is not merely intellectual assent to the idea of God; it is trusting God so much that you are willing to take risks to obey Him, thus seeing the truth and work of God in the real world. A Christian is first called to discern the word of God through Bible reading, prayer and the guidance of the church, and then to take risks of faith: the risk of faith ministry, the risk of living a life of stewardship. All of these risks of faith test faith in the real world and prove that faith is true. These risks of faith prove that God is true and what he promises in the Bible is true.

It takes courage to take the risks of faith. Faith is not passive, but involved doing courageous actions. Look at the great people of faith in the Bible: Abraham, Moses, David, Esther, Mary, Jesus, Peter and Paul. They all did courageous acts. For us today, our faith may ask us to do courageous actions, too. It may be a small but important courageous act, such as reading the Prayers of the People in church, or a big act of courage like leading a Cursillo weekend. But, as we take the risks of faith, doing what God has called us to do, our faith grows and we grow into the person that God created us to be.

In the move, *God is Not Dead*, Josh takes a big risk when he argues for God's existence in his philosophy class. He tests the reality of his belief in God. It is not easy; it is not comfortable, but it changes his life and the lives of the students in the classroom. And not just those in the classroom, but those outside the classroom. God uses Josh's faith to change the lives of many people. We should believe that when we step out of our comfort zones to perform a courageous act of faith in God, the lives of many people will be changed for the better.

Ask God in prayer to help you take risks for Him, so that your faith may be proved to be true, so that your faith will be real, and so that you may see God working in your life.



# A Statement from the National Episcopal Cursillo



#### A Statement from the National Episcopal Cursillo, May 2008

Cursillo has always kept its eyes firmly focused on Jesus and on the Mission. One of the principles of the Cursillo movement is that: We focus on Christ and His resurrection power in our lives, transforming us into the people He would have us be. Theological disputes and political issues have no part in our agenda.

The Cursillo Movement is a movement that brings together all people, whether they might consider themselves to have a liberal or conservative Christian philosophy or somewhere in between, for the common good of promoting Jesus Christ and God's Mission. It is Christ-centered and Christ-focused. The Policy of the National Episcopal Cursillo Committee is that it will not be an organization with a political or social agenda. National Episcopal Cursillo is a movement of the Episcopal Church.

We recognize, however, that a number of individuals with connections and interest in the Episcopal Cursillo Movement are no longer affiliated with the Episcopal Church. As a sign of reconciliation, we welcome those still able, as individuals, to be in communion with the local Episcopal Diocesan Bishop and fellow Cursillistas, whether lay or ordained, to participate in the activities of the Cursillo Movement. Furthermore, and always at the Diocesan Bishop's discretion, we encourage an openness to their continued participation and interest in the activities of the Episcopal Cursillo. It should be understood by all that as a part of their participation, they agree to do so fully for the advancement of Cursillo, be supportive of the mission of Episcopal Cursillo, and agree that they will not promote any political agenda.

What is clear is that National Episcopal Cursillo was created to serve the Episcopal Church in the United States, and we are licensed by the Roman Catholic Church to do that. Despite our personal theological and political views, we are focused on knowing Christ and making Him known to others. That is our call and in doing it lays our greatest joy. Ultreya! Ultreya!! Let us get on with the day's apostolic action. Let us all pray for the Church and one another everyday.

Serving on a Weekend Team is a very rewarding experience and a special blessing!

#### A Cursillista (Lay or Clergy) wishing to serve on a Weekend Team should:

- V Have attended a **4th Day workshop**; and
- $\nu$  Be active in the **4th Day** by regularly attending Ultreyas, participating in Group Reunion, and supporting and attending Las Mañanitas and Clausura when possible.

#### **Guidelines for Weekend Team Membership**

- Weekend Rectors select team members from Cursillistas who have submitted a <u>Team Application</u>
- Applications for serving on a Weekend Team will be valid until such time as the Cursillista has been selected and served on a Cursillo Team, or for 3 years, whichever comes first.
- A Cursillista may elect to submit a <u>new application</u> at any time the information reflected on his/her application changes.
- Currently, the team fee is \$265.00. This covers *only* The Claggett Center room and board.

Cursillistas selected to serve on a Weekend Team should not sponsor a candidate for the same weekend on which they are serving on team. Spouses or fiancées of Cursillo team members should not be a candidate on the same weekend on which the team member is serving on team.
