Ultreya! This marvelous charge to "press onward!" is usually used at the conclusion of a talk or event. However, I think it is a most appropriate way for me to begin to share with you all the exciting things that are happening in Maryland Episcopal Cursillo. Thanks be to God and to the faithful community in Maryland, we are indeed pushing ever onward!

As expected, Maryland 100 was a blessed and powerful experience. The candidates were exceptionally well prepared and thus were able to come away empowered, filled up and running over with the love of God. From the testimonies delivered at the Clausura, it was evident that they were truly going forth in the power of the Spirit to change the world. The weekend was followed by a spirited reunion Ultreya at St. Martins In the Field in Severna Park with over 75 people in attendance and a 4th Day Workshop at St. Thomas', Hancock in early July. Thank you for your prayers and palanca! It makes ALL the difference!

And now on to MD 101! The dates for the weekend are *October 27th -October 30th*. Rector Marjie Mack, MD 63, of St. James's Parish, Lothian has called the team, and the meetings begin later this month. The deadline for candidate/sponsor applications is September 27th. We are grateful and thrilled to welcome Bishop Eugene Sutton to Maryland 101 as a spiritual advisor! Although Bishop Sutton has served on many Cursillo teams in other, this will be his first in Maryland.

Maryland 101 will be breaking new ground in other ways as well. After a great deal of prayerful consideration, and in conversation with the Bishop Claggett Center, the Secretariat/Servant Community made the decision to move the weekend's sleeping accommodations to the cottages on a trial basis. It is hoped that this will allow more people with accessibility issues to access to Cursillo weekends. All other activities will be held in Monocacy and in St. Andrew's Chapel as has been the custom for the past 9 weekends. The two events most affected by this change are candidate drop off on Thursday evening and Mananitas. As we get closer to the weekend, stay tuned for updates and possible changes in our usual routine for these events. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have concerns or questions regarding this change. Rest assured that the members of Team 101 will make every attempt to meet the needs of candidates and do their best to maintain the spirit and intimacy of Powell Hall in the new setting.

ALSO in OCTOBER! Please come and join in the official celebration of Maryland Episcopal Cursillo's 100 Weekends - "Remembering and Rejoicing: 100 Weekends and Counting!" We will gather at Claggett on **SATURDAY, OCTOBER 1**st, beginning with Eucharist at 9 a.m. in St. Andrew's Chapel. Bishop Sutton will celebrate the Eucharist, and The Rev. Anjel Scarborough, Spiritual Advisor to the Secretariat, will commission the team for MD 101. Following that, we will gather as we did last year in Monocacy for music, discussion, and witness talks. There will also be workshops offered on Spiritual Direction, Music, and on Proclamation - the how-to of making that friend, being that friend and bringing that friend to Christ.

Lunch will be served in the Sugarloaf Hall. The day will also include the election of the new Assistant Lay Director.

What Are You Worth?

I will give them an undivided heart and put a new spirit in them;
I will remove from them their heart of stone and give them a heart of flesh.
Then they will follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws.
They will be my people, and I will be their God.
(Ezekiel 11:19-20)

Somehow I always approach the summer season thinking that my life will slow down and have a more relaxed pace. Perhaps this belief comes from reflecting on my childhood when summer vacations were full of afternoons at a neighbor's pool, riding bikes, playing with friends and family trips to the beach or to the redwoods to camp. But if I'm honest, there's a little revisionist history going on as summer vacations always seemed to go by too quickly and I was back in school before I knew it. As I get older, summers seem to go by even faster.

We live in a culture which places high value on being busy and productive. Phrases like "Idle hands are the devil's tools" and "time is money" are part and parcel of our western, and especially our American, culture. We can be led to believe that our value comes from what we do and what we produce. But there's a problem with this view - it isn't how God sees us and it does not have ultimate worth.

As a hospice chaplain, I work with people at the end of life who have had most of their abilities either diminished or removed by the disease process which will one day take their life. One of the most common frustrations my patients face is the sense that they have no worth because they can no longer do the things which gave their lives meaning: the woman who says, "I always made Sunday dinner for our whole family but I'm stuck in this bed and can't do that anymore" or the man who was the "go to" guy in the family for repairing cars who cannot leave the house anymore because it makes him too short of breath. They have fallen into the trap of believing that what they *do* is who they *are*.

This is one of the world's Big Lies I have the privilege to expose in my work and one which we all need to expose as ministers of the Gospel. What we do will pass but *who we really are* can never die - we are children of God and our ultimate worth is found within the context of knowing and trusting this truth. It is the relationships we build in this life which will last. Our relationship with God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, and empowered in the Spirit is the one thing which cannot be stripped away, and it is the foundational relationship which informs how we relate to others - our family, friends, neighbors and yes, even our enemies and those who wish us harm.

Three times in the prophecy of Ezekiel, God promises a restoration of God's people through the giving of a new heart and a new spirit. Two of the three times this appears, there is a reference to a "heart of stone" being removed and a "heart of flesh" being given. The ancient Israelites understood the heart to be the center of thinking and belief and a "heart of stone" referred to one who was closed to God and others while a "heart of flesh" referred to one who was open to God and others. Many of us had the experience of having our "heart of stone" changed through the gift of Cursillo and yet, over time, we discover other places where our hearts are hardened.

One of the places I struggle with is how activities can creep into my schedule, and I find myself succumbing to the trap of "busyness." Bishop Stacy Sauls once called this tendency the "seduction of usefulness." I suspect this is a struggle for all of us who are Christian leaders. It is a place where our hearts can become hardened and we are unable to be open and present to our most important relationships in meaningful ways.

As Christians, we proclaim a countercultural message. In a world of hardened hearts who believe that human value is centered in doing, we proclaim the truth of our value as centered on being: being a child of God, saved by grace through Christ, and filled with the Spirit. May we set aside the world's "busyness," still our souls and remember this truth so we may claim it not only for ourselves but share it joyfully with a world who needs to hear good news.





A Statement from the National Episcopal Cursillo, May 2008

Cursillo has always kept its eyes firmly focused on Jesus and on the Mission. One of the principles of the Cursillo movement is that:

We focus on Christ and His resurrection power in our lives, transforming us into the people He would have us be. Theological disputes and political issues have no part in our agenda.

The Cursillo Movement is a movement that brings together all people, whether they might consider themselves to have a liberal or conservative Christian philosophy or somewhere in between, for the common good of promoting Jesus Christ and God's

Mission. It is Christ-centered and Christ-focused. The Policy of the National Episcopal Cursillo Committee is that it will not be an organization with a political or social agenda. National Episcopal Cursillo is a movement of the Episcopal Church.

We recognize, however, that a number of individuals with connections and interest in the Episcopal Cursillo Movement are no longer affiliated with the Episcopal Church. As a sign of reconciliation, we welcome those still able, as individuals, to be in communion with the local Episcopal Diocesan Bishop and fellow Cursillistas, whether lay or ordained, to participate in the activities of the Cursillo Movement. Furthermore, and always at the Diocesan Bishop's discretion, we encourage an openness to their continued participation and interest in the activities of the Episcopal Cursillo. It should be understood by all that as a part of their participation, they agree to do so fully for the advancement of Cursillo, be supportive of the mission of Episcopal Cursillo, and agree that they will not promote any political agenda.

What is clear is that National Episcopal Cursillo was created to serve the Episcopal Church in the United States, and we are licensed by the Roman Catholic Church to do that. Despite our personal theological and political views, we are focused on knowing Christ and making Him known to others. That is our call and in doing it lays our greatest joy. Ultreya! Let us get on with the day's apostolic action. Let us all pray for the Church and one another everyday.


