Fanning the Flames • A Reflection on Faith & Fire

This past summer, I had the opportunity to take to the woods and enjoy a few nights tent camping with my younger son and some wonderful family friends. There are many aspects of this kind of activity that tap into my inner frontier woman, most especially the challenge of coming up with hearty meals cooked over an open fire. The hearty meal part was fairly easy (although I confess that copious amounts of cold cereal and Twizzlers were consumed over the course of those days and there was that nice restaurant in Gettysburg one night). It was the open fire part that proved to be a little tricky. Fortunately, among the four of us there was enough collective wisdom, experience and knowledge of raw physics that it wasn't long before we had a marvelous fire blazing. The meal was cooked, served and enjoyed, water boiled for the washing up and there was enough flame left over to warm and light our evening as the temperature and the night descended.

I re-learned some facts about fires that night. When building a fire, it takes both sizable logs and smaller kindling that have had some "seasoning. Green wood won't work. The wood must be arranged in a particular manner, stacked close enough to be able to catch the fire from one another but with enough space in between so as to allow air to flow and sustain the flame once it is ignited. The initial flame comes from a source beyond itself. It takes fire to make fire. Once lit, fires need to be carefully tended. They need to be stoked and poked, more fuel added to maintain the desired level of warmth and light. Fire spreads. Therefore, there is need to be watchful and sometimes that means containing it in order to maximize efficiency and protect against an uncontrolled and unwanted outcome. Fire is elemental. It is useful, refining, at times consuming and always powerful.

And fire is a powerful analogy for how the Holy Spirit works in the context of the Christian Community. God's people must ever be striving to become "seasoned wood" through corporate worship, partaking of the Eucharist, study of the Scriptures, and acts of mercy and grace - Piety, Study, Action. God's people must gather ... must physically stand together ... in order to set one another on fire for the things of God and the ministry He has given each one of us to do. In our coming together, the "Fire" can fall and spread beyond the confines of our churches and communities and become heat and light to a world that seems to be growing progressively dark and cold.

When 55 members of the Cursillo Community gathered at Claggett on October 9th to pray and to discern, God poked and stoked the fire. I will never forget the sense of God's power and presence that shot through me as we joined together and prayed "Come Holy Spirit, Fill the hearts of your faithful and *kindle in us the fire of your love.*" It is my prayer that as a "community of Holy Friends" each of us will commit to seeking ways to become tinder for the fire of God's love and that as a community we will be led to the ways and the means to keep the fire burning brightly for those yet to be drawn into that circle of Light and Love. When we work, pray, and serve TOGETHER, we offer one another the chance to "get lit" and fan the flame. *ULTREYA!*

Future Weekends • Now is the time to plan!

I feel like a baby chick as I have taken that step out and embraced the role of Weekend Coordinator. So far the job has been easy because you, the Cursillo Community, have not been sending me your Team Applications - and that's a problem.

MD 100 is fast approaching and Team 100 is underway - and your applications are needed! I understand, you really meant to send in the application, but your Fall, like mine, has been speeding by. Well, its time! Team 100 needs to be in place no later then the end of the year to begin planning for the weekend which will be held May 19—22, 2011. We have also signed the contract with Claggett for MD 101, which will be held October 27 - 30, 2011, and the team selection for that weekend will begin soon as well.

Remember, submitting a Team Application does *not* obligate you to serve if called ... it just means the weekend rector can, in fact, invite you to serve. After prayerful consideration, you can decline if the call comes at a time that you feel is not good for you - and, your application stays on file for three years in order to allow you to be invited to serve on a future team. Please consider being a part of MEC's future.

Answering Those Questions About Cursillo

Is Cursillo a Retreat? Cursillo is an interactive, lively, and educational weekend. Some people describe it as a "retreat" but except for the first night of the gathering, it is anything but a retreat! There is an overnight retreat from the end of the first night's activities to the morning Eucharist on the next day, but the rest of the weekend is spent in educational, workshop-type activities.

What is included in the Cursillo Weekend? Cursillo is designed to be a teaching tool for further educating us about what our call is as Christians in today's world - it has been described as "a re-teaching of our Catechism." The weekend is a talk in 15 parts ... 10 presented by Lay Persons and 5 by Clergy ... over the course of the weekend. Each of these talks is discussed in small group settings that include a mix of people from the various parishes who are attending the weekend.

Are there worship services during the weekend? There is a daily Eucharist. We are a Eucharistic church, and our teachings are based around the celebration of the Eucharist.




MD 99 Reunion Ultreya · December 11th

Over 50 Cursillistas gathered at the Bishop Claggett Center on October 9th to discuss and discern the way forward for MEC. There was a marvelous cross section of folks present that day, participants from MD1, several team members of MD 99 and many folks from weekends in-between. I dare say every corner of the Diocese was represented, several clergy were present and the overall feeling was one of hope and a renewed sense of purpose.

The day revolved around three talks (many thanks and kudos to David Mallery, Dick Mitchell and Izzy Winn!) and three topics that served to focus us on the needs and concerns of the community as we attempted to look into the future. The table discussions were lively and ultimately produced pages of wonderful and inspired ideas to strengthen and build Maryland Episcopal Cursillo. We were blessed with music provided by Mark and Bill Cox, a delicious Claggett lunch and ended the day celebrating Eucharist together.

Those gathered considered way to make Cursillo more visible, and there were many great suggestions on how to promote the Cursillo opportunity in our local parishes. We took a frank look at the apparent "aging" of the movement (and those of us, therein!) and discussed ways to reach out to former Chysalis and Happening participants as well as attract new and younger people to all that Cursillo has to offer. Grouping and lagging Ultreya attendance were also considered and some exciting new "cyber" methods and models were put forth. Speaking the truth in love, several spoke to both the perceptions and the realities of a community that has been fractured by labels and different but sincere theological positions, the need to encourage wider participation in the team process, and the necessity of more clergy involvement. And we shared a whole lot more! It was truly an anointed time and thanks to all who took the time to be present and also to those who prayed and took the time to make your thoughts known through other means.

The conversation and the subsequent action has just begun! You will be hearing much more in the months ahead about specific opportunities to "Fan the Flame". The Secretariat is taking the show on the road and we hope you will make an effort to come and participate when the Secretariat meeting and Ultreya come to a church near you sometime over the next year! At present, plans are in the works to be in Southern Maryland on January 29th, 2011 ... in Western Maryland in early March ... in Northeastern Maryland in May ... and in the Baltimore Metro area sometime this summer.

One thing is clear: Cursillo needs YOU in order to be able to continue to make all the difference in the life of the Church. It is not about those of us who have gone before, but all about those who have yet to be blessed by this amazing opportunity to become part of a community within the Church that is dedicated to raising up leaders, empowering God's people, and bringing the world to Christ and Christ to the world.

A Statement from the National Episcopal Cursillo, May 2008

Cursillo has always kept its eyes firmly focused on Jesus and on the Mission. One of the principles of the Cursillo movement is that:

We focus on Christ and His resurrection power in our lives, transforming us into the people He would have us be. Theological disputes and political issues have no part in our agenda.

The Cursillo Movement is a movement that brings together all people, whether they might consider themselves to have a liberal or conservative Christian philosophy or somewhere in between, for the common good of promoting Jesus Christ and God's

Mission. It is Christ-centered and Christ-focused. The Policy of the National Episcopal Cursillo Committee is that it will not be an organization with a political or social agenda. National Episcopal Cursillo is a movement of the Episcopal Church.

We recognize, however, that a number of individuals with connections and interest in the Episcopal Cursillo Movement are no longer affiliated with the Episcopal Church. As a sign of reconciliation, we welcome those still able, as individuals, to be in communion with the local Episcopal Diocesan Bishop and fellow Cursillistas, whether lay or ordained, to participate in the activities of the Cursillo Movement. Furthermore, and always at the Diocesan Bishop's discretion, we encourage an openness to their continued participation and interest in the activities of the Episcopal Cursillo. It should be understood by all that as a part of their participation, they agree to do so fully for the advancement of Cursillo, be supportive of the mission of Episcopal Cursillo, and agree that they will not promote any political agenda.

What is clear is that National Episcopal Cursillo was created to serve the Episcopal Church in the United States, and we are licensed by the Roman Catholic Church to do that. Despite our personal theological and political views, we are focused on knowing Christ and making Him known to others. That is our call and in doing it lays our greatest joy. Ultreya! Let us get on with the day's apostolic action. Let us all pray for the Church and one another everyday.


